# Club happenings since our Golden Anniversary.

In the five years since our Golden Anniversary the Club has not stood idle. It has helped other Organisations raise funds by staging flower festivals at Aldersgate Methodist Church, Saltaire United Reform Church, St Peters in Allerton and an arrangement at Shibden Hall. Our Arrangement at the Harrogate Spring Flower Show this April may be our most challenging.

Spring Fairs and cake stalls at club meetings and a sponsored Walk have raised funds for various Lord Mayors' charities as well as contributions to Area for Chelsea.

Four workshops have been held to raise knowledge and understanding of the Art of Floral Arrangement for the local community of Bradford and have been met with great enthusiasm. Bradford Grammar School is also very enthusiastic and waiting eagerly for the ones we will be holding in May at their Spring Fair. These were additional to the many workshops held for Club members.

We have also been busy raising funds to ensure the Club has a future. Grants have been received from Bradford West Community Chest for leaflets to promote the Club, Cnet Grassroots provided funding for new shelving, lights and stationery and the Lottery provided funding towards our demonstrators, the Website, a new sound system, screen, postage and workshop materials and just received is a small grant from Sovereign Health for Club Materials.

This funding has allowed the Club to maintain its high standard of demonstrators, whether established or newly qualified, and to have an additional demonstration at the July AGM.

New events have been added to the Club's calendar in the form of a Christmas Fuddle and seasonal dress for our December meeting, Strawberry Tea follows the July AGM and the Photo Competition running through the Summer months is growing slowly.

We have been on outings to George Smith, Kelberdale Gardens, Littlethorpe, Arley, Shibden Hall and Poppleton Hall Gardens. Our trip to Burton Agnes in June this year is already filling up fast and promises to be another very

enjoyable day though we are hoping for good weather for a change.

And in November 2010 we welcomed Norma Dobney as an Honorary Member of Bradford Flower Club.
